### POWERED BY SERVICE

Powered by Service is a one day, 4-6-hour intensive leadership program, powered by the Emory University Goizueta Business School and the Truist Foundation. It introduces middle school students to the benefits of local servant leadership, explores career paths, teaches financial literacy, and nurtures their passions with an emphasis on education. Through peer-topeer mentorship, students are able to identify their unique "spark," while developing creative solutions to positively influence their communities.



#### LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

This four-year program exposes high school students to the tools and skillsets needed to achieve success after high school, while helping them identify careers that align with their spark [passion]. This curriculum is designed to provide students with the opportunity to experience each of UNL's four pillars: Talent, Education, Career and Service. From SAT prep to navigating the college financial aid process, students are provided with key opportunities to develop themselves academically while honing their leadership skills and serving their communities nationally.



### MOGULS IN TRAINING

Students meet virtually every month to discuss higher learning challenges and receive strategic resources. Sessions foster personal development, productive college matriculation, and transitioning into adulthood. Students also receive assistance from UNL partners while seeking and securing internships. Maintaining the peer-to-peer model, the monthly sessions are led by a UNL alumnus and industry experts who've developed unique, dynamic learning models which ensure success before, during, and after college.



### DISRUPTIVATOR CLUB

Usher's New Look has been serving youth for 21 years in limited cities across the nation. For years, partners have been asking for Usher's New Look programming to expand to their communities. Through the Disruptivator Club, educators and youth will be able to create an Usher's New Look chapter in their schools. #### THE NATIONAL LEADERSHIP CERTIFICATION

Backed by the Emory University Goizueta Business School, this four-year, 400-hour training program challenges high school students in our four Leadership Pillars: Talent, Education, Career, and Service. Students are educated on how to use their spark to be of service nationally. This program works to ensure every student graduates from high school and empowers them to have agency over their journey.

#### ATLANTA LEADERSHIP ACADEMY YOUTH PARTICIPATION

A total of **92** youth, grades 9-12, participated during October 2020 - August 2021 (20 graduating seniors). Leadership Academy scholarships were awarded to **63** youth at the end of the school year. The Leadership Academy was virtual for the entire year.




### DISRUPTIVATE EVENTS




